REHEARSAL TIMES & LOCATION:

WHEN: MONDAYS 7:00pm-9:30pm (a short break is included; feel free to bring a snack or drink for yourself). The Church will be opened by 6:30PM so arrive early.

WHERE: St. Bartholomew's Church, 239 Harvard Street, Cambridge. Non-resident parking is available in lots on Prospect St. and Bishop Allen Drive; consider carpooling or taking public transit if possible.

AUDITIONS/MEMBERSHIP:

To make our music accessible to the community, we do not require auditions. However, we ask everyone to practice their music outside of rehearsal to ensure our rehearsals and concerts are the best they can be. Dues are also not required from our members, but we count on your support and assistance to stay financially strong (see next page).

ATTENDANCE POLICY:

The Cambridge Community Chorus strives to be accessible to all interested community members. However, concerts require your commitment to attend rehearsals. A sign-in sheet is provided for singers to mark their attendance at each rehearsal. If you know in advance that you will be unable to attend a rehearsal, please inform your section leader, concert producer, and officers of that fact. (See back page for contact information.)

Note: You must attend the dress rehearsals in order to sing in the concert. In addition, we have a two-absence maximum for the fall season for all regular rehearsals (including the retreat). If you exceed these absences, it is the music director's decision whether you can perform in the concert.

If you do not sign in you will automatically be listed as absent for that rehearsal.

If your name is misspelled on the sign-in sheets, please write in your corrections so we list it properly in our concert program. If you are missing a name tag, put an "N" next to your name and we will print you a new one.

CONCERT ATTIRE:

Concerts dress code is as follows:

Women: black shirt (plain or button-front ok; 3/4-length to full-length sleeves), black slacks or long black skirt (mid-calf or longer)

Men: black suit or tuxedo, white shirt, black bowtie

All: black close-toed shoes; black socks or stockings; no flashy jewelry. Please do not wear strong scents or perfumes, as it bothers other singers.

As noted above, the Cambridge Community Chorus does not charge dues. However, to cover the many costs associated with our high-quality concerts, we must raise money among our membership and the public.
